## Index of People mentioned

This index is most unlikely to be flawless. It was first compiled by the then editor of the Swansea History Journal, Gerald Gabb, in August/September 2010, partly on the basis of the regular indices put together by Jennifer Sabine over her 17 years as editor.

The references are in the form of volume number (say XVIII) and page (say 67) – so in Volume XVIII on page 67, there is information on Terry Absalom of North Hill who was killed in the blitz in 1941. On the actual Journal covers, Roman numerals have not been used since Volume XIV (2006), but, in this index, they have been retained as a way of differentiating volume number from page number.

An entry like p.34ff refers to unnumbered centre pages used for colour illustrations, an insert included in Volumes IX to XVII.

Underlined entries indicate a reasonable body of information. Those not underlined indicate smaller quantities of data. Some fleeting references have been omitted. A bold entry (**89**) indicates a page where there is a **portrait** of the individual or a picture directly related to them.

The index is aimed at those interested in Swansea history and local family history. Most of those listed lived in Swansea, at least for a time. There are also some significant visitors, and a few with no direct link. Over the years there have been some excellent articles on, for example, ceramics and natural history – the many names included in these have been included or otherwise according to these guidelines. If you want to know about national figures in these and similar fields, go to the articles themselves. There is a volume by volume contents list on this website.

It is easy to be drawn into the idea that only the rich are significant, and that only they need to be included. Here, though, rich and poor, the “significant” and the person in the street mingle freely and alphabetically.

In order to pick out individuals from the throng, very brief descriptions of people are included, as well as some indication of the dates of their lives, holding of an office, or just the year(s) when they are mentioned.
